Now that fluke is over, striped bass, blackfish and black sea bass are still on our menu, so please get your fish weighed, and get your slips to Bill Morrogh ASAP. Good luck to all.

members so they can arrange a spot for you.

Paul Cunningham has confirmed that our annual club blackfish trip will be on Monday November 2nd on the Prime Time out of Orient. Spots are limited, so pay Paul at our October GM to ensure a spot at the rail.

Fishing Report

East Winds Bring End of Summer

The most notable thing to say about this September from a fishing standpoint is that the last two weeks of the month

have been basically dominated by unrelenting east winds making for a nasty ocean. As I write this Tropical Storm / Hurricane Joaquin is being tracked. Wherever that storm tracks when we emerge from this weather pattern I would expect fall fishing to be in full swing.

Fluke season ended on the 21st. Most would feel fluking is on the decline, we'll see what next year's regulations bring, cutbacks are anticipated. Seabass regulations are getting complicated. Fishing in federal waters (outside of three miles, clearly marked on most chart plotters) closed on Sept 21st but is expected to re-open October 22nd. State waters remain open, current regulations allow 8 fish, 14 inches or greater until October 31, increasing to 10 fish November 1 through December 31. With the weather and regulations preventing boats from fishing seabass offshore, porgies have been the mainstay off the bottom fishing fleet. Fishing is reported as "good" on mixed sized scup on all the local structure.

The long awaited blackfish/tautog season is nearly upon us and will open on October 5th and run though December 14th, 4 fish per angler, 16 inches or greater. Look for the fish shallow, early on with the local bridges and shallow pieces a good bet.

Gorilla blues have set up on the mountainous structure to the west in the mud buoy area, get some bunker chum and chunks in the water and hold on! Fish to greater than 20 pounds have been reported. A couple of bass have been reported under the bunker pods along the beach.



First hand reports by club members were hard to come by this month, but we have a few, all from members with relatively new boats. Early in the month Capt. Barbara Solomon ran a couple of trips on her newly and appropriately named "Legal Limits" offshore to 140' of water and found false albacore and dolphin cooperative on the troll with fish to 8.5 lbs. She also did an inshore clam chumming trip and landed 6 bass and some blues fishing inside. (picture was cropped a bit to avoid totally burning her spot)

Captain Mike and Maryellen Zullo are sporting a new ride as well, aptly named the "Magic Too." They ran their new Yamaha powered 30' Pursuit to the deeper wrecks south of the inlet where a virtual aquarium awaited. They reported a nice catch of seabass and cod, while small makos and some mahi circled the boat. Mike said that, as usual Mep decked the big one, a 5 lb. plus seabass, while he looked on. Great report and best of luck with the new ride!

Offshore reports are scarce of late. Prior to the east blow, chunking was good at the 100 square with a mix of YFT, LFT, and BET. The Bacardi area has certainly had it's moments too, with mixed sized YFT and BFT available on the chunk day and night.

Is anyone holding weigh slips for Fluke, Weakfish, Tuna, Mahi, False Albacore or Green Bonito? Get them in NOW! Note that FTC rules state that derby weigh slips must be presented within 2 weeks of the derby close.

Our 2nd Sea Bass derby (9/5 - 10/12) is only inshore (<3miles) after 9/21 due to Federal regulations.

The Fluke derby closed on 9/20.

The 2nd Weakfish derby and 2nd Tuna derby closed on 9/27.

The 2nd Mahi derby, False Albacore derby and Green Bonito derby closed on 10/4.

All of these derbies will be awarded at the November GM.

If you're holding weigh slips that may be eligible for an annual award, NOW is the time to send them in to the committee. Don't wait until the last minute.

If you see your name on the website derby page and haven't received your award please come out to the October GM!

New Rates For The FTC Marina!

Winter storage: We have made arrangements with Atlantic Yacht Haven for placement of all boats on the property. You can use any hauler that you choose but they must call Chris or Alan in order to find where your boat should be placed on the property. This includes all trailer boats. Chris and Alan at Atlantic Yacht Haven will be in charge of placements of boats on FTC property for winter storage. Please call 516-377-7720 or 516-523-3444 to find where your boat will be located on the property. The new system will allow for better management and increased storage capacity.

New summer slip rates for 2016:

\$78 per foot with no minimum for a slip during the summer season

\$175 for trailer with a summer season slip – no grandfathering of trailers

\$250 for trailers without a summer season slip (number on property set by property committee)

\$150 per month for boat storage on land for members during the summer season

\$14 per foot for Winter Storage for members \$17 per foot for Winter Storage for nonmembers (\$340 minimum)


