You get out of your club what you contribute! The Pres.






Fishing Report

Fall Fishing is about to Commence

It seems like we got robbed at the end of September and very early October as a large stationary front has brought unrelenting NE winds for what seems like two weeks. Early in the month we had a good blow too, losing a few days due to weather. Looking ahead at the marine forecast I see another few days or variable NE winds, more grey skies, and an ocean that might convince many to stay home and do the fall chores. When the weather does break the fall run will be in full swing and we can add blackfish to the available species list on October 5th.

Despite a good blow early in September the fluking held up right until the end. On the closing day of the Fluke season I took one more shot. Coming up empty with crew I sailed solo and fished several wrecks just inside the twenty fathom curve. When I arrived the drift was too fast so I anchored up. Fishing a high lo rig with clam I quickly caught a limit of seabass along with mixed porgies including some real jumbos. Fluke were my primary target so while at anchor I decided to toss my bucktail rig around the boat. This technique can work well when conditions are tough, especially in deep water. I picked away at fluke, landing a decent 4.5 pound keeper right under the nose of a shameless mugger who thought my *Emily S* was his marker buoy. Have a little respect out there and keep your distance. Better yet, find another wreck...



The wind and current eased up and I went on the drift taking a couple more keeper fluke. Drifting two more wrecks I completed my fluke limit making for a nice mixed bag and a great way to wrap up the fluke season. Nick Nero prospected some new fluke grounds finding a few with one nice keeper. You never know until you try. The only other first-hand fluke report for September comes from Bryon King of the *Kingfisher* running out of Shinnecock. Just before the blow, he reported a "very good fluke bite, on the Reef in 85' of water, and a couple more in 90 as well." The highlight of the trip was what he thought was the granddaddy of all fluke that turned out to be a small thresher, estimated at 25 lbs. The fish was safely released.

On to seabass. I want to clarify that the seabass regulations are more complicated than I reported last month. The possession limit increased to 8 fish on September 1 and will increase again on November 1 to 10

fish per person. However, in Federal Waters (beyond 3 miles out) Seabass are closed from September 22 through October 21. A nautical chart or your plotter should indicate where the three mile line exists. A quick glance shows that the Rockaway and

Fire Island Reefs are completely in-state waters (inside of 3 miles). The Hempstead is completely outside of three miles, and the troublesome Atlantic Beach Reef has portions of the NE edge in state waters but the majority lies in federal waters. Be advised...

Seabass fishing improved in September from a quality standpoint with some notable catches reported. Ken Kapner ran his *Reel Catch II* "twenty miles out" with a crew of

Woody Anderson, Arnold Fleisher, and Leo Ferrity. They had a great day putting 24 seabass and 60 porgies in the box. *(continues on next page)*

Mike and Maryellen Zullo ran their *Magic Too* to the seabass grounds. They reported very good fishing with 5 over 4 pounds and 10 over three pounds. While we are talking bottom fishing note that BLACKFISH will be open Oct. 5 through Dec. 14 with a 16" minimum size limit and 4 fish bag limit.

We've all heard the term clam up. Now it's time to crab up

In other inshore news the weakfish have put in good appearances just about all over Long Island and Porgies have filled in nicely while we wait for the offshore seabass to reopen. Striped bass are being clam chummed at the bridges and bottom fishermen are picking a few outside too. The ocean is loaded with bunker so hopefully we will enjoy a banner fall run.

Offshore reports seem like a distant memory. A lackluster season put on hold of late due to the weather. When the weather settles down I'm sure the chunking game will be on in full force. Fall sharking is a good option, a few threshers have crept into the west end reports mostly from the Debs Inlet crews. There are tons of mixed sized bunker and chub mackerel in the ocean. Remember, big fish eat little fish ...

OUR GUEST SPEAKER GREG METZGER

Greg has been teaching marine science and aquaculture at Southampton High School since September 2001. In his 14 years, he had the opportunity to design and build one of the most state-of-the-art marine labs found in a publicly funded high school in the country. His program educates hundreds of individuals of all ages each year in the area of marine science and the industry of aquaculture.

Metzger's knowledge base and personality communicate his own enthusiasm to others and it is contagious. To some, the science appeals; to others, it is the hands on "let's touch a shark!" What Metzger's doing offers many levels of engagement across all ages and demographics.

Most recently, Metzger and a group of fellow researchers formed the Long Island Shark Collaboration (LISC). This team has set out to better understand the population dynamics of all large coastal sharks found along the south shore of Long Island. In addition, LISC hopes to begin to unlock the mysteries of the young of the year white sharks found in these local waters.

Metzger is an adjunct professor of aquaculture at Stony Brook University. He also has held a Master Near Coastal U.S. Coast Guard license since 2005 and runs a successful charter business. His charter service focuses on teaching clients the biology and research behind the shark species being targeted rather than the harvesting of the animals. His clients get to participate in the real science being conducted on sharks in the ocean waters of Long Island. He has also delivered public lectures and conducted workshops educating citizens on the basic biology of sharks and the scientific methods used by shark biologists to gather data.


