Blackfish opened up on the 15th, good catches have been reported locally from the bridges to the reefs.

Further offshore the Yellowfin and Bluefin bite at the beginning of the month was solid with fish being caught both trolling and chunking. The last round of storms shut the bite down, but they are starting to bite again and will hopefully continue on into November.

New Member Kon on a recent charter on the Patty Ann had a great trip landing 7 nice yellowfin. He was also on a long range





trip out of San Diego where steady action with yellowfin kept everyone busy.

For anyone fishing the north shore bays and sound, there has been an epic fall run taking place. Bass and bluefish have been providing almost non-stop action. Casting lures has been the best producer, nothing better than a top water bite.

I want to stress the importance of you calling or texting me a few days before your boat is coming and then again the day before. The reason is things change daily for the placement of boats. It's also **VERY IMPORTANT** that you put your last name on your trailer if you are on one, or write it clearly on your shrink wrap. Because, if your boat needs to be moved or there is any other issue we feel you should know about, we would call you. Saves a lot of time if we know the name of the boat owner, Instead of us trying to figure out whose it is. And lastly, make sure if you are on a trailer your front jack is in 100% working order. If it isn't you may be charged for a new one if we have to change it to move the boat. It's hard enough to move trailered boats around the yard. Please don't make it any more difficult than it needs to be. Replace it if it's a rusted piece of junk that doesn't work. If we all work together and be patient all should go smoothly. Thank you

Light spinning rods with top water plugs and conventional rods with circle hooks are the gear of choice.
