FISHING BULLETIN

This past month witnessed start for our inshore species, last year when the same tir showed results on the other espectrum. Time will tell here as areas water temperatures are still a little on the warm side. Continued falling temperatures both during the day and night



should be the catalyst that is needed to jump-start our fall fishery.

Our canyon fishing has just about come to a close for out FTC Fleet. Although the party boats will continue to target this fishing until it's all over, this is the time of the year when the days grow shorter and the weather can turn suddenly to make for a very uncomfortable ride home even if the boat is loaded with fish. We were once again treated to a phenomenal run of fall bluefin tuna. Once the fish moved off from the Bacardi area they settled along the east elbow of the Hudson Canyon with several of their larger brothers and sisters. The results were great if you got in on the action. These fall tackle busters were reported up to 350lbs.

Our once greatly anticipated fall shark fishery was a bust for most who took the time to target the fall run. The reports from our club members stated that it was dogfish city from top to bottom. Keeping bait in the water was short lived before it was ravaged by the relentless schools of dogfish that have taken up residence on our fall


fishing grounds.

Fall black fishing has started out with less than desired results. Scouting trips that were made when the season opened up were reported to be on the slow side with small fish and not many numbers. The good news is that it has changed for the better and showing the way it needs to be done has been Paul Hilton aboard his vessel, Emily S. His most recent post on our club website indicates that it might be time to try again. Our resident bottom fisherman Mike Zullo has also confirmed this during a recent outing.

Seabass have started to push their way offshore and the cooler temperatures will continue to spur their migration into the deeper water and ultimately their winter hibernating grounds. We can expect several more weeks of good fishing as these fish transition their way offshore.

Our local striped bass action has rebounded and this time the action has been in our back yard. Most of our members that have targeted bass have reported pretty decent action. Last weekend Capt. Chris Bellinzoni skippered his bass boat "Four Bells" with past presidents Ron Leonardi and John Hachman for a bass trip of a lifetime. The final tally was in excess of fifty bass with the crew keeping their limit. Nice job guys.
