FISHING BULLETIN

We were treated to a summer and early fall of picture perfect weather. That changed once the month of October rolled around and we paid dearly for it. Not only did we have record rainfall but our club boats stayed tied to the dock for most of the month as well. For the offshore commuter the fall weather was

not on there side. Its unfortunate since the fishing looked like it was about to break wide open. This past month witnessed a very nice start for our inshore species, Crisp evening temperatures will continue improve this fishery as our season wears on.

Our canyon fishing has come to a close for out FTC Fleet. Although the party boats will continue to target this fishing until it's all over, this is the time of the year when the days grow shorter and the weather can turn suddenly to make for a very uncomfortable ride home even if the boat is loaded with fish.

Our once greatly anticipated fall shark fishery was a bust. For most who took the time to target the fall run, one trip with top to bottom dogfish was enough. The Kristen, looking to keep her legendary status sailed an additional trip and managed a 250lb Blue Shark, which kept the crew on its toes until the fish showed itself.

Fall black fishing has started out with a bang. Our members who have targeted them have reported very consistent catches, however a fair amount of small fish has made up the bulk of the catch. The fishing is better out east where recently



Howard Berman reported excellent action to the west behind the clam boats most of the fish in the teen size. Congratulations are in order for Doug Toback. Last weekend during the Shootout he and his crew landed the top three fish to give our club enough points to take finally take back the trophy.

I am proud to announce that the FTC Board will be announcing some wonderful changes in the awards for 2006. As the world goes digital the FTC goes GLOBAL......That right! We are bigger that US Steel for the year 2006. Our Board has voted and approved five new angler awards for the largest of five species: Blackfish, Seabass, Cod, Fluke & Flounder. The all new Global Award shall read as follows:

Special Awards

Five (5) Club trophies will be awarded each year: One (1) for the largest Fluke; One (1) for the largest Codfish; One for the largest Weakfish; One (1) for the largest Blackfish and One (1) for the largest Sea Bass. These awards will be awarded to the member catching the largest of each species and weighing the fish on a certified scale and recorded on an official Freeport Tuna Club weigh slip. This is a Global Award.

Note: If you think you have a winning fish it is your responsibility to check with the awards committee prior to weigh slip deadlines which are always two weeks after each derby closes. You must keep the white weigh master stamped copy for your records and the buff goes to the committee also with weigh master stamp & signature.

FISHING TIP FOR NOVEMBER

Fishing live bait is a very effective technique for catching big striped bass, bluefish and weakfish. At this time of year however, bluefish and striped bass are very numerous each afternoon between the Roundhouse and the Rockaway's. Just steam West till you see the birds working an area. Tie on AVA 47 Jigs with no tubs on them. Use a three foot 50# leader and have a ball. The fishing is best two hours prior to sunset and you'll most likely hit the bocks after sunset, but you'll always be rewarded with plenty of action. After their fall blackfish trips the APHIS drops in on these fish. Their last trip of October boated and released over fifty bluefish and three striped bass. To catch the bass jig three to seven feet off the bottom. Oh... and remember to sharpen the hooks to a knife point!
