FISHING BULLETIN

As the end of the 2006 season looms in front of us one can only think "If we only had the weather" I

know this has been my frustration and many more club members reporting the same scenario. For most of us the last six to eight weekends have been blowouts for offshore fishing. Some club members braving the brief weather windows that made themselves available, but for most of the time we were faced with flag starched wind conditions during our commutes either to or from the offshore waters. Its unfortunate since the fish were staged on the grounds and the only thing we required was the ability to get out. Our inshore fishery has started off nicely and should be a welcome reprieve to all club members who look forward to this time of the year.

A mid October canyon trip aboard the offshore sled, Mikey Likes It, reported a twenty plus fish day on the troll with long fin and yellowfin tuna lining the inside of his fish box. For most of the FTC Fleet our canyon fishing has come to a close for this season. Party boats will continue to fish well into the month of November, however shorter days and unpredictable weather can make an excellent trip a white knuckled ride home in the towering seas typical for this time of the year.

Our fall shark fishery spawned some life this year, our resident shark veteran Larry Festa sailed his

Kristen to the offshore grounds during a break in the weather in mid October and club member Bob Demeno nailed his first Thresher, a rather nice 189lb. specimen. Several other FTC boats made their appearances on the shark grounds and reported action as well.

Our fall blackfish season started off the season in a robust way. Our bottom fishing experts the, Magic Too, Tin Man and the Emily S reported a nice showing of fish up to 7.5 lbs. Although typical for this time of the year are the multitude of small fish the make up the bulk of the catch. The fishery looks promising and as the local waters continue to cool down, hopefully the quality of the fish should improve.

Our Seabass have started the migration offshore, the cooling waters will chase these fish further offshore onto the deeper water wrecks with their ultimate destination being their winter hibernating grounds on the 30-40 fathom wrecks.

Our East End club members have reported an excellent fall fishery to date. Capt Jim Krug, aboard his Persuader has reported excellent bass fishing with many fish in the thirty pound range and an equally as good blackfish bite with nice quality fish coming over his washboards.

Our local striped bass had been good prior to this past weekends storm force winds, The Joint Effort and our past presidents Bunker Dunker reported quality bass action on the bunker schools

with fish reported in the mid twenties. Our local inlet has produced school sized fish clam chumming for those who prefer a more tranquil day fishing anchored up.
