This is it for 2011. We have 5 derbies running that cover both the inshore and offshore scenes. There are no slips yet for shark, cod or blackfish. striped bass slips are in the 16-20lb. range and are beatable if you put in some time. Our bluefish derby has been amazing! You have to go back to the 2002 derby to find a fish that beats the current 3rd place fish which is 15.44lbs. There's a first place tie for bluefish at 18lb. which is 3lb short of the club record set in 1977!

PROPER WINTER STORAGE

I hope all FTC Members enjoyed their boating season this year, as it rapidly comes to a close. In order to hit the ground running next year the proper storage of your vessel during the winter lay-up is key. Here are some tips that over the years are of importance:

- During haul out it is always best to power wash your bottom
 while the growth is still wet from the salt water. The ease of
 removal will assist in maintaining the anti fouling quality on the
 bottom paint.
- While it is still wet, washing the hull with and "On-Off" Hull cleaner. This will remove all water stains, brown scum, old wax and other impurities, which will make the spring waxing job go much smoother.
- 3. Always remove your propeller during the winter lay up. Propellers left on could get damage. A slight bend in a whee; that you cannot see could lead to a short haul and additional expenses. In addition the propeller should ALWAYS be sent out to a reliable propeller shop to be check for items such as stress cracks, electrolysis, balance & trueness. Your propeller is the most important part of your boats propulsion system and should be a priority. Also when the propeller is off it gives you an opportunity to carefully inspect the shafting under the propeller for any signs of stress cracking. This also holds true with outboard motors. Lastly with the wheel removed you should conduct a very careful inspection for any fishing line which may have gotten caught up in the cutlass bearing or splined shaft. Modern braided lines and mono-line can really wreak havoc on bearings & seals.
- 4. Shrink wrapping is another option for the winter. If you elect to do so make sure that all antennas, loading coils and radar antennas are not put under heavy load with the pull of the shrink wrap which can easily crack a GPS coil or warp an open array radar antenna. Refrain from using blue tarps and other covers than fit loosely, high winter winds can cause these course tarps to rub on the glecote finishes and do more damage than no cover. In addition when lower antennas for the season the tip of the antenna should always be higher that the base. This can prevent water from settling in the antenna tip and causing damage.
- Store you boats with full fuel. On land condensation in fuel tanks can occur which could also lead to spring launch problems. This is true for both gas & diesel.
- 6. Batteries should be removed and stored indoors & not on garage floors. The batteries should be top off with distilled water for their winter lay-up and trickle charged. Batteries that are not easily removable and stay on the boat should also be top off with distilled water, fully charge them and lastly disconnect the negative lead on the battery to prevent any possible draining via the ground.
- If your vessel is bonded always check the bonding system with a continuity meter. Each piece of under water metal is checked for continuity back to the bonding zinc plate.
- 8. Use only pink non-tox for your winterization. Engine antifreeze mixing is not the way to go. pink non-tox is designed not to effect seals & impellers during lay up. It is also I good idea to pour a gallon or so in your bilge and pump some out via your bilge pumps to protect them.
- **9.** Make sure you leave some **destine** inside the boat to prevent moisture and mold during the lay-up.
- 10.Lastly, if you are doing to do your own bottom work & maintenance, such as painting & scraping make sure that you protect our environment. Tarp the ground under your vessel and dispose of all used motor oils & coolant properly. Most service stations are required by law to assist you in the proper disposal of these environmentally harmful fluids.

I hope you find these ten tips helpful during you winter lay-up.
