Fishing Report

An October of Pienty

The air and water cool down and the wind does blow but October is the month when the fish begin to feed heavily in preparation for migration. Stripers and blues work their way south and west.

down the coast. Tautog work their way out of the bays and near shore structure, taking up residence on the 40-80 ft. structure and feeding heavily. Seabass work their way offshore, eating everything in sight along the way. The bass and blues are right on schedule, the bottom fish maybe a little late with 60 degree water still present.

Striped bass have been grabbing the headlines throughout Long Island. Along the south shore, the number and size of the bunker pods is unprecedented, and the bass and blues are all over them. Live liners and trollers have had the edge but some fish have responded to jigs as well, and the party boats are getting in on the action too.

Fish up to 50 lbs. have been reported and large bluefish have joined the mix making for exciting mixed bag fishing just off the beach. Captain Barbara Solomon and Pete Cefai have been on the bass, catching and releasing many fish into the 30 lb. class. On another trip, Pete joined Nick Nero on his Dolce Vita and reported bass to 23 lbs. along with large blues just off the Pink Hotel.

Chris Bellinzoni of the Four Bells reports great bassing to the west on live bunker. Both the Four Bells and Ralph Drews of the Oceanic have had consistent fishing with fish in the 30 to low 40 lb. class. On one exceptional single tide trip they had several bass over 40 and a half a dozen over 30 lbs.

Steve Valenti has been the hot hand while fishing on both boats. That's some great bassing, congrats to the captains and crews. In addition, the Oceanic had a 100 lb. thresher on a bunker spoon, with other threshers reported on spoons further west.

Seabass fishing took a back seat for a while with the closure in federal waters (beyond 3 miles). With the unseasonably warm water, fish were still available inshore. Now that the water is cooling off and the deep waters are open, the seabass are moving off and the reports are quite good, with limits on fish being reported from structure in 80' on out. With big bluefish invading the area, I would run too....

Blackfish opened on October 5th and will remain open through December 14th. Current size and bag limit is 4 fish per angler, 16" or greater. As usual, the best early season fishing is found on the shallowest pieces, including the local bridges and bay structure. Outside, fish are available out to 70 ft., but the best keeper ratio has been found as shallow as you can go. Looking at a chart of our area you will see that most of the shallower reefs and wrecks lie west of Jones Inlet and sure enough that's where the best blackfishing has occurred so far. Exceptions are some very shallow wrecks east of the inlet where good fishing has occurred but the pressure is heavy. My trips of late have been limited to half a day or less fishing right outside Jones Inlet to maximize fishing time. Fishing has been OK, with lots of shorts, some seabass and porgies, and enough keepers to 5 lbs. to make it interesting. It will only get better.

Many boats like to take advantage of an early morning bass bite, then head off for seabass or blackfish to round out the catch. Be advised it is illegal to possess striped bass outside of state waters (three miles). The 3 mile line should be clearly visible on your plotter. If you plan on mixing bottom fishing and bass, save the bass for the afternoon.

I have been bugging Captain Jim Krug of the Persuader III for some Montauk reports. Captain Jim and son's Bobby and Jack have a reputation for making life very difficult for the local fish population. Captain Jim reports a "great year at Montauk" and went on the bombard me with pictures of some outstanding catches of large bass, fluke, shark, tuna and blackfish. Bass fishing was red hot with numerous fish in the forty pound class

and a 53 lb. specimen landed. While they await the next wave of stripers, he has been blackfishing at Fishers Island, with limit catches to 9 lbs. and reported the fish are in the shallow water. South/ east of Block Island, they have enjoyed excellent seabassing with large porgies and some cod in the mix. The large bass have left Montauk, apparently tasking up residence along south shore.

Offshore, Captain Chris Gerhart of the Wasabi reports, "The weather has been horrible for much of October, with tiny windows that close quickly. We have not been out, but friends fished last Thursday into Friday at the Hudson. They had a good mix of fish including a bigeye, sword, 2 longfin, and 2 Mahi. Definitely not on fire but some fish around." *Thanks Captain Chris!*




