

Kick Some Bass While You Can


As I write this, wind is from the west at 33 knots, gusting to 48 and wave heights at the Fire Island buoy are reported at 16 feet. That's beyond "sporty." Just prior to this blow west end striped bass fishing was coming on, as the fish migrate west and south along the coast.

Here's a great report from Chris Bellinzoni and Team *Four Bells* who participated in the 23rd Annual Kismet Inn Striped Bass Tournament with an all Freeport Tuna Club crew of Al Casciano, Steve Valenti, Christopher and Chris Bellinzoni. Team Four Bells took Second Place with a 33.04 Pounder with Christopher on the rod. That fish was caught on a live bunker fishing on the edge of the bunker schools just east of the Fire Island Pines. Just moments before, "Sr" fed and landed a feisty 23 pounder, which made the top ten as well. Nice job, Congrats to All !

The best is just about upon us as fish are being reported via live lining, chunking, eeling, clam bellying, plugging and on the troll. Trollers are using bunker spoons, mojo rigs, and stretch plugs with great success. The action has now spread from east of Fire Island all the way west.



Captain John Jutt has been eager to get in on



the action, looking for that "50" having trolled up a couple of nice 45 plus pounders (just shy the 50 mark) the year before. Recently, John worked the waters west of Jones, and out to 50' recently and reported tons of bait. With his brothers Tommy & Jimmy and Steve Bassford onboard, they trolled a combination of bunker spoons, mojos and stretch plugs and landed several bass up to 30 lbs. They did their best fishing away from the huge pods of bait.

Stripers have been reported all the way out to 60' of water, which, depending on where you are along our shore, can put you beyond 3 miles off and into federal waters. It is illegal to possess striped bass in federal waters, regardless of where they are caught. I have been approached and boarded three times in the past two years while anchored in federal waters bottom fishing. All they care about is whether or not you have striped bass onboard (and seabass too, when that is closed in federal waters), a word to the wise should suffice.

Bottom fishing opportunities abound. Seabass have once again opened in these federal waters and fishing is good right on out to the 30 fathom wrecks, particularly to the east. It's early for the fish to be that deep, but with the huge population of seabass we are now experiencing it seems they are being forced to spread out and move early, despite un-

usually warm water. Inshore, porgy fishing stayed red hot with a nice sprinkling of triggers in the mix.

Blackfishing for most is reported as so-so with keepers sometimes hard to find. Some very large fish have been reported working the shallower structure like the Rockaway, McAllister and AB reefs. I made several trips fishing the north shore, near the bridges, along the beach, and on out to wrecks in 65'. I have caught fish both shallow and deep, with enough keepers and many shorts. This fishing will improve as the water cools down. I am happy to report that my new tog jigging outfit has been put to good use. Jigging works well, is tons of fun, and I was holding bottom in 65' of water with a 2 oz jig using 15 lb braided line recently. To be continued...

Due to a combination of nasty weather, and a lack of fish, reports from the offshore grounds are scarce. A mako or thresher is reported here and there, but angler participation seems down as many focus on striped bass. 2017 may well be remembered as the worst canyon tuna season in memory off of Long Island.

I hope everybody enjoys the great fall fishing not to mention the holidays that lie ahead. Please send reports and pictures for inclusion in your club bulletin. Thanks to all who contribute, but we need more of you!

Property Manager's Report

The winter storage season began November 1st. The leases and invoices have been mailed and you should have received the mailing prior to the October meeting. I mailed winter leases to all captains that stored with the club last winter and to those that have contacted me. If you have not received a winter lease by October 12th just email or text me your mailing address and the length of your vessel and I will send you a lease. I will also have leases available at the October GM. This year the rates are: \$14 per foot for members and \$18 per foot for non-members. For non-members there is a \$360 minimum fee (20 feet). **Remember that FTC policy is "First check received, is first served"**.

Again this year, we have made arrangements with Atlantic Yacht Haven for placement of all boats on the property. Using professionals will allow the club to maximize the number of vessels stored on the property. You can use any hauler that you choose but they must call Chris Squeri or Alan Bregman at Atlantic Yacht Haven in order to find where your boat should be placed on a property. This includes all trailer boats. **All boats should be identified with the captain's/leaseholder's name on the trailer, shrink-wrap, or other visible location.** Chris and Alan at Atlantic Yacht Haven will be in charge of placements of all boats on FTC property for winter storage. Please call 516-377-7720 or 516-523-3444 to find where your boat will be located on the property.

Captains interested in having access to their vessels may obtain a "clicker" to open the gate at the FTC Property. A \$40 deposit is required. You will receive your deposit back when the clicker is returned. Text, email, call, or see me at the November GM if you wish to obtain a clicker.

If you have questions or concerns about the club property you can see me at the GM or Captains and Anglers. You can always contact me either by email or phone.


