FISHING REPORT

The October fall fishing has certainly not disappointed anyone that has been fishing on both the inshore and offshore grounds.

Offshore the yellowfin bite at the secret spot has still been going strong. Again Ralph Drews on his *No Mercy* and Jimmy Woods on the *Jenny II* has trips with solid catches of yellowfin to 80 lbs on the chunk and troll. Inshore sharking has also been active with many nice threshers coming to the scales. Bob Bohlert on his boat *Joint Effort* brought in a nice 200 plus thresher early in the month. There is still time to get in on the offshore action I am guessing the fish will be around well into November.

Inshore the blackfish have been chewing with some real nice catches for many members. Ken Donowski, Bob Pandy and other club members have been hitting the east end party boats with impressive blackfish catches into the double digits. The local reefs and wrecks have also been producing nice catches of Blackfish, a non member recently weighed a 17.4 lb fish from the AB reef.



On the striper grounds plenty of fish have been around with slot fish being difficult to find some days. On the Hooker we have had fish to 46" on spoons and mojos. The Red Dawn Rising, No Mercy and Kingfisher have also had great action with fish to 49". With all the bait around we should have a good pick of fish for a few more weeks.

Bob O'Brien reported that Chris O'Brien fishing 4 mi SW of Debs in 40' of water using eels had non-stop action - 16 fish 10 30+lbs 4 over 40lbs 2 were 46 lb and 47 lb respectively. Chris is now a member of the 40 lb. club. Bob says he's fished 40+ yrs for stripers and never got a 40lb. - he's so very proud of his son!

STRIPER DIARIES EPISODE 25

BIG SWELL!!! When it comes to fall fishing, it is important to keep sea conditions at the forefront. Big ocean swells typically take place in October, and this year has been no different. With 7/8 ft walls of white water at both Jones and Deb's Inlets, getting into the ocean to find the elusive striped bass has been difficult. This year, we turned our attention to black-fishing at our local bridges, when the ocean forecast called for

unfavorable sea conditions. Our visit to several different local bridges rewarded us with plenty of action. Green crabs and conventional set-ups proved to be a winner. Although we had plenty of 'shorts', we were able to put together a nice catch for the dinner table! What a blast.

With the big swell, we also turned our attention to skinny water bass fishing. Our 16ft Alumacraft boat, powered with a Mercury 40hp does the trick. This little boat is a gem, and is perfect for drifting eels through the cuts and navigating into tight spaces. Throwing bucktails into drains and casting top water plugs into the marsh are very productive tools in the arsenal.

Now that a ridge of high pressure has finally arrived, the ocean forecast looks MINT. It's time to seize the day, and yesterday we did just



that! My plan was to head out of Deb's Inlet and look for birds. Truth is, I had not fished the ocean in two (2) weeks, and had no idea where to go. Sure we heard reports of bass in the usual spots -but fish have tails. As we approached the inlet, it was flat and the sun was blazing. We motored out and what I witnessed next was unbelievable. PROPERTY COMMITTEE

With the freezing temperature overnight on 10/30/20 the water at the property might be shut down any time now. If you plan to store your boat for the winter at the property be sure to send a copy of the lease (downloadable from the website) proof of insurance and a check for \$15/foot for your boat. Send to Freeport Tuna Club, PO Box 5, Freeport, NY 11520 - ATTN: Don Granger. Arrangements to have your boat placed on the property can be made through Travelers Marine. If you use a different hauler check with Travelers as to placement on the property. Please be sure your name appears either on your shrink wrap or on your trailer. All freezers are to be emptied and shut off by December 10, that accommodates all you bass and blackfishermen. After that the property committee will shut off your freezers. To keep those who summer dock at the club, this year's rate will bew \$80/ft (with the pay in full option at the first payment date receiving a 5% discount). We retain the right to move boats as needed to keep a full marina. Once the marina empties the bubble system will be deployed - please stay off the walkways as much as possible! Also, please disconnect your hoses from the outlets or we'll need to disconnect them to blow out the water lines - you take a chance leaving them on the docks to freeze and crack. Stay safe, stay warm... spring is just around the corner.
