The Canyons have had some great chunking when you can get out with quality yellowfin and long fin caught. Swords have also been in the mix and some mahi as well.

Striper Diaries Episode 33

FALL RUN.... October can produce fish from the skinny water of the back bays, to bridges and marshes. This year proved to be no different. With light tackle in hand, we set out to work the local drains on the outgoing tide. When fishing in skinny water, it helps to have a flats boat - luckily the 16ft duck boat serves that purpose.

It was a typical fall day with bright sunshine and beautiful temps. The southwest winds kept most of October warm which kept

the bait in the bay. As a result, the marshes continued to hold fish. I like to target bass with extra light gear and custom plugs. Some of my favorite lures are built by legendary west coast builders Mike Fixter and Orlando Campos. I am fortunate that my brother, who is an avid surf fisherman, is privy to all the latest and greatest inventions.



I swear by these lures. They can produce fish on the toughest days, and when the fishing is red hot these lures are on fire.

We pulled up to our favorite local spot and began to work the marsh. My rule of thumb is that after 7 or 8 casts without a hit, move on. This style of fishing means you cover a lot of ground and don't waste time in areas that aren't holding fish. After a few casts we found the fish in only 4 feet of water. Bam! Just like that it was game on. Nice striped bass up to 26 inches on custom plugs. It doesn't get better than that. The next few trips produced much the same. Small to medium sized fish, just under the slot limit. With the bait finally moving out of the bay, it was time to head to the ocean in search of larger fish. Reports in the ocean have been slow and steady. Bigger fish, over 40 inches are being caught on the troll. Mojos and bunker spoons do the trick. In the next few weeks, I am hoping the jig bite becomes red hot. Only time will tell. Until my next adventure. Tight lines.

Know your Kno

 Easier to tie right, and consistently the strongest knot known to hold terminal tackle. Double about 4" of line and pass loop through eve.

> Let hook hang loose and tie overhand knot in doubled line. Avoid twisting the lines and don't tighten knot.

3. Pull loop of line far enough to pass it over hook, swivel or lure. Make sure loop passes completely over this attachment.

4. Pull both tag end and standing line to tighten. Clip about 1/8".
