## **FISHING BULLETIN**

The 2004-year has come and is almost gone. I am not sure where the time is going however I hear that as we get older the time goes by faster. If that is the case then we should start thinking about the 2005 season because it will be here before we know it. It seems like just yesterday I was sitting down to write the January Bulletin and now I am writing the December one. Our season for most club members is coming to an end and it is evidenced by the amount of boats that are occupying our property for winter storage.

On the local fishing front, our fall black fishing on our local reefs never materialized to our expectations. The fishery is starting to take on the pattern that seems more typical for mid to later December and that is a migration onto the deeper water pieces. The reports that are coming in from 17 Fathoms as well as wrecks in the 90-100 foot depths are evidencing this. Currently the water temps are in the very low 50-degree range and a colder snap might light this fishery up even better. Our east end crew has been having a pretty decent season with the "tog" on a recent outing Sy Karp bested a 9.5lb. Black fish aboard the new Persuader, skippered by Capt Jim Krug.

The offshore pieces are giving up what they are supposed to at this time of the year. On a recent pre Thanksgiving Day trip aboard the Aphis skippered by Howard Berman, his crew encountered cod to 37lbs. And sea bass to 4.0 lbs. He reported that all the drops were made from 120ft to 150ft and that action was had on all of them. The cod were reportedly caught in the deeper water. The next day Capt. Larry Festa skippered the Kristen to the 20-mile wrecks and reported a bang up job on the seabass with the fish up to 3.0lbs. I can only hope that this fishery will continue and I say that with my fingers crossed since our winter fishery has been non-existent since 1997.

Our local striped bass has tailed off as of late. Just two weekends ago Chris Bellinzoni, on his Four Bells, had a banner Saturday in the inlet with so many fish caught they ran out of bait. The next day proved a little more difficult and the fish were caught, but by working harder than usual.

Once again, in closing I hope that the membership has enjoyed reading my reports during this past year. I take an enormous amount of pride in serving our organization by contributing my time and research to one of the best fishing clubs in our area.

#### CONSERVATION

This year was generally defined as the good the bad and the ugly. The fishing was generally good, particularly with striped bass. The fluke regulations were pretty bad. The fight over the saltwater license was pretty ugly although we won.

Looking ahead to 2005, The fluke regulations will come out around February or March. No one knows what they will be at this time.

Striped bass will probably go to two fish on April 15th. The second fish must be 40" or more. The winter flounder season is under scrutiny at this time. The two leading proposals necessary to reduce recreational fishing pressure 48% are: 1) Close the season for March and April to protect the spawn. 2) Keep the season as is with a 2 fish limit. These are drastic measures to protect this fishery. The size limit is definitely increasing to 12 inches. We are trying to look at


