# he 2005 season has almost come to a close for most of us; our boats starting to take up space on property signaling the end of the season. The exception is the angler who derives pleasure from fishing in the cold weather; they say this is the

best time of the year. This

past fall season witnessed

one of the best inshore and offshore bottom fishing seasons in many years and it is not over yet. If the weather holds out then we could see good fishing right through the New Year, as the areas water temps have not yet cooled all the way down.

On the canyon scene, yes that is correct, I am still writing about it and its December. Off shore veteran Mike Jacobs sailed his "Desire" with several of our members to the southern end of Toms Canyon last weekend and located a bunch of big Bluefin Tuna up to the 200lb mark, keeping there limit and releasing the rest. The weekend before the "Wasabi" encountered the same action fishing south east of the "100 Square"

On the local fishing front, our fall black fishing on our local reefs continues to be strong. From the Rockaway's to Fire Island, most any drop in the 60-80 ft. range will yield a good catch. The fishery eventually will take on the pattern of a migration onto the deeper water pieces and we can expect to see that once water temps are on the decline. Most recently Paul Hilton, skippered his Emily S to a small drop and landed his limit of fish up to 7.5 lbs, the largest I have heard of to date.

The offshore pieces are giving up what they are supposed to at this time of the year, the largest kind of Seabass. Congratulations are in order for Howard

Berman and his crew of the "Aphis". He has stepped into my old shoes assuming the role of a "seasoned offshore wreck fisherman". His weekly ventures to his favorite offshore "honey holes" have yielded the finest kind of Seabass with many of his catch breathing on the sixpound mark. A sprinkling of cod has rounded out his catch and the corners of his fish box as well. Wanting to gun in on the same action Scott Schafer skippered his "50/50" accompanied by crew of John Jutt and myself to an offshore piece in 30 fathoms of water south of Montauk. The decision to fish that depth was the right one as we proceeded to catch quality Seabass and Cod with several Seabass north of the six pound mark. On this trip our president broke the FTC Club record for Seabass by landing a seven pounder. This fish unseats our famed junior angler, Bobby Krug's, six and one-half pound fish landed back in 2002.

Our local striped bass and bluefish continue to show that the fall run is still very strong. On most days these fish can be jigged from 20-50ft of water along the beach. The Margarita Bill and several other club boats have been doing this on a weekly basis when the weather allows.

I hope that the membership has enjoyed reading my reports during this past year. I take an enormous amount of pride in serving our organization by contributing my time and research to one of the best fishing clubs in our area.

## FISHING TIP FOR DECEMBER


Fishing live bait is a very effective technique for catching big striped bass, bluefish and weakfish. At this time of year however, bluefish and striped bass are very numerous each afternoon between the Roundhouse and the Rockaway's. Just steam West till you see the birds working an area. Tie on AVA 47 Jigs with no tubs on them. Use a three foot 50# leader and have a ball. The fishing is best two hours prior to sunset and you'll most likely hit the bocks after sunset, but you'll always be rewarded with plenty of action. After their fall blackfish trips the APHIS drops in on these fish. Their last trip of October boated and released over fifty bluefish and three striped bass. To catch the bass jig three to seven feet off the bottom. Oh... and remember to sharpen the hooks to a knife point!
