## President's Message ...

## **Trying To Reason With Hurricane Season**

Suddenly the lyrics to that song have a whole new meaning. How do you reason with a force of unimaginable power that sows indiscriminate destruction? The answer is that you can't. All you can do is make preparations and take precautions, and then deal with the aftermath as best as possible.

The above paragraph is how I began last month's president's message. It was written six days after the storm, with a droplight over the desk and the computer plugged into a generator, in an attempt to get it to John Jutt in time to make the bulletin. As it turned out events prevented the November bulletin from being published. The passage of time often puts things into perspective, and the developments over the past few weeks have convinced me that what I wrote then is still appropriate now. So let me continue with that message, one month further down the road:

We are waterfront people; that is one of the reasons that we belong to a fishing club. Our waterfront lifestyle has lots of benefits, but the price of these benefits is the risk of living close to the forces of nature. When the water is at your doorstep you don't have much of a buffer between you and Mother Nature. Many of our members live on or close to the water, and most have suffered some damage to their homes. In addition many other members have had their boats damaged, despite taking all reasonable precautions. Our thoughts and our prayers go out to them as they begin to pick up the pieces.

Our property, all things considered, did not fare too badly, thanks to the pre-storm precautions taken under the direction of the property and house committees. Almost all the boats in the water were moved to different locations, the awning was removed and the ramps to the docks dismounted. Nothing, however, could mitigate the effects of the tidal surge we experienced: the water came up until it was about five feet deep at the fence, and 35 inches deep inside the clubhouse. All of the docks came up over the tops of the pillings and remained secured only by the dock lines left behind when the boats relocated. One dock in the basin landed on top of the bulkhead and was left hung up half in and half out of the water. Everything around the clubhouse—freezers, refrigerators, the stainless tables, the barbecues—everything wound up in a pile against the northwest fence, covered with about two feet of marsh grass. The boats that were stored on trailers were pushed up against the fence or dropped on the ground.

The club is a community, and when times are tough a community pulls together. We put

The club is a community, and when times are tough a community pulls together. We put the word out, as best as possible, that a work party would be organized on the Saturday following the storm. I wasn't sure how many people we could expect; after all, everyone has had their life turned upside down. Our club showed its strength in the response. Captain Larry has a nice post on the website about the day's work, but he only mentions about half the people who contributed. We had about thirty members present, working on the docks, removing debris, cleaning out the clubhouse and rinsing off the things that could be saved. At the end of the day all the docks were back in position and secured, the ramps reinstalled, the clubhouse washed out and vacuumed, all the ruined freezers and refrigerators piled up to be removed and a truckload of marsh grass and debris removed. Everyone did a great job, but I want to mention two people in particular: Pete Cefai, who was everywhere with his bobcat, lifting floats, removing freezers and loading trucks with debris, and Nancy Principato, who made a lunch run and fed the entire work party. We often say we have the

best club on Long Island; the reason that statement is true was on full display this weekend.

That was what I knew when I wrote that message. Well, it wasn't just that Saturday the membership turned out; a good number of people came back on Sunday, and again the next weekend, and as a result our property today stands in pretty good shape. The electric should be restored soon, along with the heat and water; all due to the efforts of our members working together for a common cause. Our members really are a special group of people, and the more we come together the better we all are.

Moving back to this month we have our Christmas party to look forward to on December 9. We have combined the December GM with the party, in the same manner we combine the August meeting with the Luau.

The business portion will be very short, and then the fun will begin! We all need a break after the last few weeks, so let's fill the house and raise the roof!

I also want to note a change of personnel on the Board of Directors. Due to the demands of his employment Chris Bellinzoni has tendered his resignation as a member of the board. As always with Chris he put the needs of the club first and willingly stepped aside when he found he was prevented from participating to the extent he wished to. I thank Chris for his years of service to the club as a board member and officer; moreover, I want to thank him for the personal support he has given to so many members, myself included. When I was new in the club, and nobody knew who I was, Chris went out of his way to make me feel welcome and involved. We are what we are today because of the efforts of men like Chris Bellinzoni, and I am proud to call him a friend. At my suggestion the Board has appointed Ray Geiger to serve out the remainder of Chris's term. Ray has been an active member and I am sure he will be a valuable addition to the Board.

This is my last message as president. In many ways it has been a challenging year for the club, but I believe we have risen to each challenge, positioned the club to successfully meet the future, and have had a lot of fun along the way. Any success we have enjoyed this year surely has nothing to do with me personally; all the credit goes to an outstanding executive board, an engaged, active and creative board of directors, and the best membership to be found anywhere. We are waterfront people, all drawn together by a common interest; but it is about so much more than just catching fish. It is a deeper thing, hard to put into words but very real nonetheless. Melville explained it in Moby Dick far better than I every could: "There is a kind of magic in water that draws all men. Follow any path; ten to one it will lead you to water. Follow that stream of water, and eventually it will lead you to the sea. The sea, wherein each man finds—himself."

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your president.

## FISHING BULLETIN

## OFF SHORE REPORTS:

### **HUDSON CANYON:**

Captain Chris Wasbie reports his first Big Eye of the season @ 207 lbs! Here is Captain Chris's Blow by blow:

"We did a last minute crew trip to the Hudson this Friday into Saturday after recovering from our beating last Sunday/Monday. Heard of spotty but good fishing from the elbows down, but decided to not run all the way down and put our lines in a bit north of that. Trolled about an hour or so when



the port side short rigger goes off, not the huge explosion or ripping of wine... but in about 1 minute into the fight, the fish woke up, and it was game on. 40 minutes later we had him circling in the starboard corner and bobby put a dart into him. Finally after being a half step too early or late on the bigeye bite all season, but catching lots of YFT and LFT, we had our bigeye, a 207# beauty!"

Captain's Larry & Ralph crewed on the Captain Deadly out of Fire Island and reported a nice catch of 4 Longfin Tuna and 3 very health 70 lb. Class Yellowfins on the night chunk.

The bottom line is some boats caught & some did not.

### Fall Sharking:

Into the first full weekend of October the fall sharking in our area has been a bust. To date the honey holes to the east such as the Yankee & Linda areas along with the western spots such as Monster ledge & the Mudhole has produced all zeros for sharks! The fishery was pretty productive during mid September.... The drop off is hard to explain.

On October 13th with a great weather window both Captain's Rick F/V "Liven Large" & Captain Paul F/V "Second Chance" made their runs with Captain Paul at the Rock Plies & Captain Rick at the Yankee. At 2 PM Captain Paul had his only bit of the day as a 150 + make snatched a bait, then went airborne and unbuttoned, making good his escape leaving the crew with only a fish story.

### **Captain Rick Reported:**

"Headed out to the Yankee. picked up some false albacore in the morning but nothing but dogfish. Water was clean and around 64 with a nice drift but the sharks were not home. Heard on the radio some one from Fire Island picked up a 250 class make further east but the guy was not specific and may not be reliable."

## **In Shore Reports:**

### On The Beach:

Our wire troll bite is on Captain Paul "F/V Second Chance" reported a very fine catch of Bluefish, Green Bonito and a nice 26 lb. striper on Columbus Day.

October 13th the bass beach action was covered up pretty good with alligator bluefish. Captain Pete F/V "Off the Hook" reported great action on the blues over 10 lbs.

### **Striped Bass:**

Captain Chris ran his "F/V Four Bells" to Kismet, Fire Island and reported a great live bait Striped Bass bite with the biggest hitting the scales @ 35 lbs. On our local inlet front, Captain Chris reports consistent catches of quality bass on clam belly and even better quality and bigger stripers on eels at night.

### **Blackfishing:**

Opening day was off with a bang! Both Captain's Mike Zullo & Nick Nero reported full limit catches on their first drops. Four fish @ 16" is no easy task. According to Bottom Barron Mike Zullo a 16" blackfish is about 4 lbs. and ten years old!

If you are looking to fish the bays, Captain Billy "F/V White Knight" reported fine keeper blackfish under our local bridges.

If you plan on going this our local law enforcement is aggressively enforcing all laws. The USCG is enforcing boats tying up to the bridges

& ice breakers. The fines can be quit high. In addition both the Bay Constables & DEC. are enforcing the Black Fish bag & size limits. For armed is fore warned!

On the quiet before the storm Captain Nick Nero had a banner blackfish day fishing the good bottom to the west with 25 tog released plus his limit with fish up to 5 lbs.

### **Reefs & Wrecks:**

From Staten Island on October 8th Captain Steve Rodes "F/V Legacy" reported a slammer trip at the Sandy Hook Reef with a full four man limit on porgies, seabass and blackfish!

On October 13th Captain Ken F/V "Reel Catch" hit the Jersey Reefs. Ken had a good catch of both porgies and seabass.

On that same weekend Captain Peter F/V " Off the Hook" Had a great catch of seabass over 3 lbs. in the V/O the Mud Buoy along gorilla blues.

On October 23rd Club Member Anthony Testa Chartered the F/V "King Cod" out of Moriches. It was one of the best offshore wreck trips Anthony has ever had. They had all quality cod and plenty of them. Limiting out with Cod to 35lbs and many 20 lb class fish. The weather was perfect with lots of life offshore.

The weekend of October 20th was a bust! The weather was not conducive for fishing.

Members that went were limited to fishing the bridges for Blackfish and Trolling wire on the beach, both which produced catches. Captain Ralph F/V "Oceanic" had a banner Sunday bite! His day started with spoon trolling by Debs Inlet with non stop bluefish. Next Ralph set up on the Atlantic Beach Reef which produced plenty of keeper Seabass, Porgies & a few Blackfish. Once they had their limit Ralph ended the day by fishing the outgoing tide in our inlet with bellies and limiting out on Stripe Bass to 20 lbs.

### **Montuak Reports:**

Captain Charley Sporing fished Oct 6th & had 14 stripers up to 35 lbs. along with a nice brace of seabass and porgies.

October 13th Captain Mike Sullivan reported zero on the Montauk Bass bite.

On our derbies currently cod & shark are opened along with bluefish and blackfish.


