

Fishing Report Holiday Season Home Stretch

The leaves and acorns came down early, some would say signs of an early and severe winter to come. Last winter was relatively mild and easy with the exception of the one big snow dump. This year we shall see. I do know that we have had lots of wind but mild weather is forecast for the foreseeable future so there is still time to get out and fish. Several angling opportunities still exist for those willing to bundle up and put in the effort.

Arnold Fleisher, Leo Ferrity and Bob McVey with Nice Stripers

Bob McVey reports a great trip on Saturday November 5th aboard Ken Kapner's *Reel Catch II* along with fellow members Leo Ferrity and Arnold Fleisher. In his words, "Just after we exited Jones Inlet, we joined in the party of boats picking up bunker. Within minutes we had all we needed to target striped bass. We started trolling east towards Fire Island Inlet when we hooked up our first fish, about 20lbs. When we were east of the Rota wreck we started live lining. Soon Leo landed a 24lbs. 11oz. striper. Bob followed with a nice 25lbs+ fish. After exhausting our supply of bunker we started trolling back West to call it day of good fishing."

Greg Koharek and his crews had an amazing year. They kicked it off winning the Woodcleft Shark Tournament with a 411 Thresher, then catching some nice tuna, an 80 lb. wahoo, and numerous quality striped bass on his boats *Ambition* and *Ambition* 2.

In this most recent report, Greg was both the captain and angler on his *Ambition 2* for a striped bass that weighed in at an impressive 47.5 pounds. The fish took a live bunker off of Tobay. On that day numerous other bass between 36" and 44" were released. The big girl took the ride home. Congrats on a great catch and outstanding season. Currently, striped bass fishing is winding down. However, fish are still being jigged to the

east by the Captree fleet and those fish will come our way so keep your eyes open and get your last licks while you can. Large bluefish

are still present as well.

The blackfish season is well underway. Most would report it as slow, with a good effort required just to obtain a 4 fish per angler limit, picking through lots of shorts. Some real big fish are available however, and I am aware of a 16 pounder

watched a 14.5 lb. blackfish weighed in at Woodcleft Fishing Station. I know for sure that the 14.5 lb. fish was caught locally because the boat was nearby to where I was fishing! My own trips saw decent fishing, limits some days and some good quality fish up to 8 lbs in the mix. The season is open through December 14th. The best is ahead of us, "crab up," anchor on some structure and catch some blackfish while you can.

Seabass have been working their way offshore and boats from Montauk to Sheepshead bay are making impressive catches on the deep water wrecks. The day after Thanksgiving, Nick Nero decided to make a run with his 25' Parker *Dolce Vita*. Nick had a crew consisting of his friend Sal, Pete Cefai, and Pete's brother Frankie. Nick ran to the 30 fathom wrecks where they were rewarded with lock and load fishing for large seabass up to 5 lbs and "hub cap" sized porgies too. Very nice ...

Absent from these offshore bottom fishing reports has been any substantial bycatch of cod. Montauk had a nice run of fish this summer and fall, many are hopeful for a good winter run out east, and that the fish will filter toward the west end too. The availability of herring, mackerel, or sand eels will determine their movement. Fingers crossed...



The Uni-Knot System

One basic knot which can be varied to meet virtually every knot tying need in either fresh or salt water fishing. That was the objective of Vic Dunaway, author of numerous books on fishing and editor of "Florida Sportsman" magazine. Here is the system which resulted.

Tying to Terminal Tackle



1. Run line through eye of hook, swivel or lure at least 6" and fold to make two parallel lines. Bring end of line back in a circle toward hook or lure.



2. Make six turns with tag end around the double line and through the circle. Hold double line at point where it passes through eye and pull tag to snug up turns.



3. Now pull standing line to slide knot up against eye.



4. Continue pulling until knot is tight. Trim tag end flush with closest coil of knot. Uni-Knot will not slip.

Know your Knots Isop Connection

Tie same knot to point where turns are snugged up around standing line. Slide knot toward eye until loop size desired is reached.


Pull tag end with pliers to maximum tightness. This gives lure or fly natural free movement in water. When fish is hooked, knot will slide tight against eye.

1. Overlap ends of two lines of about same diameter for about 6". With one end, form Uni-Knot

circle, crossing the two lines about midway of overlapped distance.

2. Tie Uni-Knot, making six turns around the two lines.



The Uni-Knot System

3. Pull tag end to snug knot tight around line.

 ${\bf 4.}\;$ Use loose end of overlapped line to tie another Uni-Knot and snug up.

5. Pull the two standing lines in opposite directions to slide knots together. Pull as tight as possible and snip ends close to nearest coil.




